General Exchange Information

Visa Procedures

For HKSAR passport holders who will be staying in Canada for less than 6 months are not required to apply the Canada Visa. However, according to the most updated news announced by the immigration department of Canada, visa-exempt foreign nationals who fly to or transit through Canada will need an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) starting March 15, 2016. Orientation Activities

CISSA held a orientation day before the semester started. That is a very good opportunity for you to know more about the University and meet more other exchange students. Make sure you check the email from time to time for the registration of the orientation.

Accommodations

I chose to live on campus and there are 6 halls offered to international students by the University. Remember to check your email from time to time in case there is an email concerning the hall application. At last, I chose to live in Cascade Hall in which it gathered so many exchangein students from the globe and it made you easier to meet them through hall activities.

Course Registration

I took 4 courses in total: ACCT425, ACCT443, PSYC203 and SGMA591. You can take up to 5 courses maximum in which at least 3 courses should be business-related courses. All courses use absolute grading. The workloads of all the courses are relatively high. There are quizzes or assignments almost every week for each course. Once the University confirmed you as an incoming exchange student, you will have to submit an application form concerning all the courses that you would like to take during exchange. If some of your courses require prerequisites, you will have to submit an unofficial transcript to the hosted University for proof. The exchange coordinator will help you register the business-related courses in advance. You only have to register common cores by yourself later on. The course registration system in UofC is similar to SIS system that we use in HKUST.

Sports and Recreation Facilities

The most famous sports centre in UofC is the Olympic Oval – ice skating indoor centre. There are also an indoor swimming pool, gymnasium, fitness centre. You can do almost every indoor sports here like badminton, volleyball, basketball and squash. And there is rental for outdoor sports like skiing, snow shoeing and snowboarding. The entrance and rental fee are quite low and it is highly recommended if you like doing sports!

Cost / Expenses

The living expense, especially the food expense is quite high in Calgary. I usually cooked at hall and shared some groceries with my roommates so as to save up some money for traveling or doing outdoor sports. I spent around HKD85,000 including all my flight tickets (Calgary, and West coast of US) and hall fee for the whole 4-months exchange journey.

Social Clubs / Networking Opportunities

There is a Club week held in the 2nd week of September and there are more than 300 clubs for you to join. It is a great chance for you to meet more friends in Calgary!

Transportation

All students, including exchange students, are required to buy UPass for the public transportation fee. It costs around CAD125. And you don't have to pay for transportation fee by taking public transit (C-Train) and bus. If you want to go out shopping to pay a visit to somewhere else like downtown, you can go to the University C-Train Station, which is just 10 minutes away from the main campus of UofC. If you would like to go other cities like Vancouver, Edmonton or Banff, you can take a bus called "Greyhound" to there.

Climate

The weather there is quite the opposite of that in Hong Kong. The air is dry and the temperature is cold most of the time. The temperature difference within a day is large, it is between 12 to 15 degree difference. The coldest weather during my exchange was in December and it was around -20 to -25 degree Celsius. It started snowing in late November and that was beautiful! Remember to buy all the warm jackets together with water-proof gloves and shoes before the snows come.
