

# **Part 2: General Exchange Information**

# Visa Application

For HK ID and Mainland ID holders, no visa is required.

# **Courses Registration**

The course enrollment system was not well-established and always got into crash. But the administration offices of each faculty were quite helpful that they could almost ensure you be enrolled in any course you like.

#### Accommodations

Free accommodation was provided by SJTU. Usually, exchange students will be assigned to the undergraduate dorms located in Minhang Campus, while few business students are luckily to be assigned to dorms located in Xuhui Campus. Every room consists of four bed spaces and one washroom. Unfortunately, you may need to adapt to the squat

toilet, which is the mainstream for most mainland universities. By the way, you have to pay for shower using your student card and the shower time is strictly constrained: the shower room opens from 3:00pm to 11:59pm only.

We did not need to pay the accommodation fee since it was sponsored by the university.

#### Food

There are 6 canteens in Minhang Campus and 1 canteen in Xuhui Campus, providing a large variety of foods. Actually you don't need to eat at canteens for every meal as there are numerous restaurants serving foods from different provinces and countries. Besides, o2o economy is flourishing in Mainland. You can always open food-ordering apps like "饿了么" , "美团外卖" , "百度外卖" , etc. Usually it takes half an hour from your payment to the receiving of the food.

#### Climate

It was super cold in the first few months after I arrived Shanghai. But it got better in April. Shanghai in April is in her most beautiful time. Comfortable temperature, fascinating scenes, delicious foods...life could not be better. And it is also a wonderful time to travel.

#### Communication

Most courses are taught in Mandarin, but you can always register English courses, especially business courses.

# **Transportation**

Subway is the most convenient and economic way to transport within Shanghai. And taxi is not expensive compared to that in Hong Kong. O2O car-calling apps can also help to escape from the peak hour of Shanghai.

Download "滴滴出行 "and" 嘀嗒拼车 ", you won't be regret.

In addition, shuttle bus offered by SJTU is also convenient when transporting between different campuses.

High speed trains can take you to any corner in Mainland with an affordable price and a comfortable environment.
