January



PART II – General Exchange Information

1. Visa Procedures

As an exchange student who is going to stay in Sweden for more than 3 months, it is necessary to get a residence permit card before leaving Hong Kong. To register the application, please visit

https://www.migrationsverket.se/English/Private-individuals/Studying-in-Sweden.html and create a new account. This year, they have a new policy that you can only get a certificate in Hong Kong. You still need to apply for a residence permit card after you arrived Sweden. You need visit the Swedish embassy to have your picture and your fingerprints taken for an entire visa. The processing time depends on the details of your enclosed documents.

2. Orientation Activities

Before I come to Sweden, my buddy will contact me through Facebook. She provided all the details I need. She guided me to apply for a student account, connect to the school wifi, check-in my residence, get a campus card, etc. They would list out all the orientation activities for you.

3.International Services & Activities

They will guide you to join some campus activities. You can join any of the student union based on your interest. They organize various activities such as parties, movie night or cooking class. Sometimes, they will offer some trips for you such as Finland, Abisko.

4.Accommodations

Uppsala University Housing Office handles accommodation for exchange students. You are required to finish the housing application before the deadline as late applicants will not be offered housing.

Flogsta: Most of the exchange students lived in this dorm. Its location is super good as It just takes 10 mins to business school Ekonomikum, 1-2 minutes to supermarket ICA. There is a Flogsta scream everyday(10pm)

5.Courses Registration You can visit this website to have more information.

It is required to take 30 credits in total for a semester and at least 15 credits in the Department of Business Studies. You have to finish all the registration before leaving except the Swetish class.

6.Teaching & Assessment Methods

Each course requires students to prepare for presentation every week. Teachers will introduce some important theory to you in lectures while in seminars, students take the initiative to lead discussion and do presentation. It takes you for 45 for both discussion and presentation. You are asked to read all the materials and answer questions during the lesson.

7.Sports & Recreation Facilities

There are no free gym and facilities for students. You have to pay for the gym. I didn't join any sport club so it is better to go for orientation week to have further information.

8.Finance & Banking

It is quite expensive to eat outside in Sweden (around 150SEK for salad or pasta) Therefore, it is better for students to cook to save some money for travelling. You can find cheap ingredients in ICA. In Sweden, a student who only stays for half a year is not eligible to open a bank account in Sweden. It is because we cannot get the personal identity number for creating a bank account. I suggest students to exchange more Euro, but not Krona. It is not common to use cash in Sweden.

9. Social Clubs & Networking Opportunities

Students are recommended to join different nations as you can meet many exchange students in there. By joining the nations, students can also have chances to work in the café. It is a great opportunity to earn some money and meet amazing people in there. You can also join some trips to Abisko or Finland. It is more easy to build up a good relationship.

10. Health & Safety

Sweden is pretty safe among European countries. But it is still important for you to not walking alone at night. There is no bus available after 2-3am. It will be dangerous and scary to walk alone. Also, it is illegal to drink on street.

11.Food

It is expensive to eat outside in Sweden (around 150-200SEK). Sometimes Nation will provide cheap lunch or dinner but I will still think it is expensive. Most of my friend cook in dorms. It is quite fun to gather together and share our food. It is way for cheaper to cook food by yourself. After class, we will go to ICA to purchase some discounted food in order to save money. (around 20-30SEK per meal)

12. Transportation

In Uppsala, people will either bike or take bus. It costs 39SEK for every single trip. It is strongly recommended to purchase a monthly unlimited card which only costs 500SEK for bus. If you want to travel to another city, you can take train from Uppsala Central City.

13. Climate

the weather in Sweden is extremely cold and dry. It is snowing every day. The climate is around Odegree Celsius to -20 degree Celsius. In April, the climate is around 0 degrees Celsius to 10 degrees Celsius. In May, there is no more snow and you can go picnic.

14. Communication

Swedish people speak fluent English. However, most of the description box in ICA or other supermarket are in Swedish. You can download google translate or directly ask people for simple translation.

15. Cautionary measures

It is important to wear enough clothes and avoid walking alone at night!!
