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
Monthly Activity Log

July/August 2019

General Exchange Information

1. Visa Procedures

You will need to obtain the Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) from Usyd first before applying for the student visa Subclass 500 (For further details, you may look up from this link:

https://immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-avisa/visa-listing/student-500) All international students studying in Australia are required to get the OSHC, which will help you cover the costs of medical and hospital care while in Australia. You will be asked for evidence of your OSHC when applying for the visa, so make sure you have it ready before you start the online application.

2. Orientation Activities

Before the semester starts, you will receive emails from your exchange officer about the arrangements of the orientation day, please keep an eye and pencil down the date. I strongly recommend all of you to join the orientation since you will meet other exchange students around the globe, this is a great chance for you to make friends and learn more about the University.

3. Accommodations

Regiment Building and Queen Mary Building are your choices for on-campus accommodations, I chose Regiment since it is newer and closer to the business school. Urbanest is the off-campus accommodation recommended by Usyd, there's different room types and locations you can choose from, Urbanest@Cleveland Street and Urbanest@Sydney Central should be closest to Usyd main campus.

4. Courses Registration

Course registration system of Usyd is very different from UST, you will first receive a course list from the exchange officer and then you can select the units of study and upload your photo for your student ID card on your student portal. And then Usyd will confirm your enrolled courses and you will receive a personal timetable. If you would like to change your units, you need to email the exchange officer before the add/drop period deadline.

5. Teaching & Assessment Methods

The teaching style of the lecturers in Usyd is quite different from UST, you are expected to do the readings and go through the textbooks before class and raise questions. Some courses may have coursework in the beginning of the semester and tutors may not explain the assignment beforehand. You have to keep an eye on the deadlines and take the initiative to ask your tutor if you got any questions.

6. Sports & Recreation Facilities

There is a University Sports & Aquatic Centre located near to the business school which gives you access to a wide range of sporting clubs, group classes and cardio machines, however they do charge a membership fee.

7. Finance & Banking (including currency / expenses)

I recommend opening a bank account at the Commonwealth Bank, there's no annual charges or a minimum amount of deposit. So you can pay with your phone and no need to carry cash around with you all the time.

8. Social Clubs & Networking Opportunities

There is a lot of social clubs and student societies and they welcome exchange students to join them. All you need is USU membership, which you can sign up for during Welcome Week or online at any time of year.

9. Health & Safety

Sydney is a pretty safe place, but stay away from nightclubs and bars especially during late nights on Fridays and Saturdays.

10. Food

The Asian food in Sydney is very authentic since most of them are run by immigrants. The brunch is also very nice, get yourself an all day breakfast with a cup of coffee on your first day and you will not regret it!

11. Transportation

Be sure to apply for the Opal concession card once you arrived in Sydney, you can enjoy half price for all public transportation within travelling NSW. Remember to download TripView Lite app on your phone to know the train schedule!

12. Climate

The climate in Australia is quite comfortable, you can enjoy a mild winter and will gradually get warmer if you are coming to Sydney in the fall semester. But please do remember to wear sunscreen all the time, since the sunlight is extremely strong during the day and you can get sunburnt easily.

13. Communication

English is the official language in Australia.
