Visa process: University of Exeter gives CES for students to apply for student visa. In addition, if you want to travel to Europe and you are not a Hong Kong permanent residence, you better apply for a Schengen visa before your departure.

Accommodations: I took the offered university accommodation. The experience is on average level.

Course registration: four courses. Remember to check the credit transfer database and do proper planning.

Teaching and assessment methods: similar to HKUST.

Finance and banking: only a few GBP cash exchange for emergency is recommended. Most cash flow need can be fulfilled through credit card, including most Hong Kong VISA cards.

Social clubs and networking opportunities: a lot of clubs to join and fun experience.

Health and safety: be careful of Covid.

Food: not much good food on campus. I bought some kitchenware and cook my own food. And it's way cheaper.

Climate: way colder and drier than Hong Kong. From January to June, you don't need to bring a lot summer wears.
