







March

General Exchange Information

Visa Procedures

I did not apply for a Visa as I am an HKSAR passport holder during the exchange. If you planned to stay over six months or would like to apply for internships in the UK you would need to apply for a Visa. At the border, the Customs officer will ask some simple questions to confirm your purpose in visiting the UK. You should always bring your official acceptance letter or the Confirmation letter sent by UoM with you whenever you travel back to the UK.

Orientation Activities

The AMBS will arrange some orientation activities near the start of the semester. During the orientation, they gave some basic information about the school and the city, they also arranged a city tour and a visit to the Peak District. During the tour, you can know more about the history of the city and also get to meet exchange students from all over the world.

International Services & Activities

The international society will organise different parties and tours to let you know more about the UK and fellow students.

 \cdot Accommodations

Before going to Manchester, you would need to choose five accommodations on a platform and will be randomly allocated to one of them. I was assigned to Denmark Road which is an en-suite room. There are four supermarkets within 8 minutes' walking distance. A bus station within 4-minute walking distance. The Whitworth park and museum are just in front of the hall. The hall environment is good and a good place to stay when u stay in the city.

Courses Registration

The course registration is mainly completed through email. The process is simple and you can register for the courses that you want. You will need to register for about 50-60 credits according to the requirement and each course will take up to 10-20 credits. I registered the following courses:

Teaching & Assessment Methods

Most of the course has a light workload. It is truly a place where you can experience university life. Most of the courses will have 100% on the exam. Some of them will have around 20% in essays and 80% in the exam. The exam is mostly of short and long questions. As it is still under pandemic, the exam was online and open for 48 hours for handing in the paper. The professors

were energetic and they are passionate about teaching. Apart from teaching theory, most of them will use real-life examples to explain how the theory can be used in real life.

Sports & Recreation Facilities

Some of the halls provided a gym and there are also gyms and also swimming pools around the campus.

Finance & Banking

I did not open a bank account in the UK instead I apply for the HSBC Mastercard Debit Card which I mainly used throughout the trip. You can use this debit card in the UK and also during your trip to Europe as long as you have GBP and Euro in your bank account. However, the card might be invalid sometimes when booking some budget hotels or tours. I suggest you bring about 2-3 credit cards with you as backup. Also, I opened an account for a virtual banking call "Monzo". You can use it in the UK and Europe as long as you have GBP in the account. You can add money into the account through bank transfer or the supermarket.

Social Clubs & Networking Opportunities

The AMBS and international society will have a Whatsapp group to organise different parties and activities. You can register as a free member at the international society office and then participate in different activities at a discount price. They will have some afternoon tea for knowing students from different countries and also different weekend day trips to different cities.

Health & Safety

As it is in a pandemic situation, the school originally distributed free testing kits. They stopped giving it out when the government announced to lift all the bans in the UK. I brought 1L of alcohol and 500ml of alcohol rubbing to England. You can buy spray alcohol on Amazon called Ineos.

Food

I usually self-cook in the hall. There are Morrisons, Tesco, Sainsbury and Lidl within an 8 minutes walking distance. It is very convenient for me to buy ingredients from different supermarkets. There is also one oriental market just around the corner where you can buy cup noodles and different Chinese food to cook.

Transportation

There are 147 free buses within the campus area to the Piccadilly train station. The bicycle route in Manchester is well developed and it is straight through Fallowfield through campus to the city centre. If you want to travel to a different city in the UK, you will need to take the train to a different city. You can book the train ticket through the trainline and get a discount by registering the 16-25 railcard online. Uber is commonly used in the UK.

Climate

The weather is very rainy and windy in Manchester. I always wear a waterproof and windproof jacket so that it can keep me warm and dry when the weather conditions suddenly turn bad. In the coldest time, the temperature is about 0-5 degrees Celsius outdoors while it is very warm indoors.

Communication

I use Giffgaff for the sim card as it is freely distributed at the hall. And then I turned to use Smarty, as I can enjoy a free month if I was recommended by a friend. Remember to confirm with the company that the value that you added is truly added to the account or else you will constantly receive a message saying that your account is empty.

Cautionary measures

Always keep an eye on your belongings. There was some stabbing news and also someone rubbing students in the curry mile. Remember to put your belongings in pockets that were zipped and well protected.
