
# <u>November</u>

# **General Exchange Information**

## Visa Procedures

I did not apply for any visa as I hold an HKSAR passport. It allows me to stay in the UK for no more than 6 months. You have to decide how long to stay and check whether your passport requires a visa. When you enter the UK, they will ask you to show your acceptance letter, so make sure you bring a copy with you.

## **Orientation Activities**

AMBS will arrange activities during the induction week, and you could meet other exchange students there. Activities like city tours and Peak District visits are free to join, it is a great chance to explore the city.

## International Services & Activities

There is an International Society that arranges activities and tours, so you can travel around the UK easily.

## Accommodations

After receiving the confirmation letter, you could choose 5 accommodations on the university's system. Although there is a chance of not getting accommodations you wanted the most, it guaranteed accommodation for AMBS exchange students. I was assigned to Dalton Ellis Hall, a catered hall full of exchange students. If you want more personal space, make sure you choose an en-suite room and submit the preferences as soon as possible.

# Course Registration

I registered for the courses through email. Each course usually takes 10-20 credits and exchange students are required to register 50-60 credits. You could also email the AMBS team if you have any questions regarding course information, they are helpful. I registered the following courses:

## Teaching & Assessment Methods

The workload is light for most courses, so you could spend time traveling around. I did an online exam that was open for 48 hours which is really flexible. I enjoyed the classes a lot as the professors were very passionate.

#### Sports & Recreation Facilities

There is a Sports Hall on the Fallowfield campus, but it is far from the city center. You have to book and pay to enter, but sometimes it is free.

#### Finance & Banking

Previous exchange students suggested bringing the HSBC World Debit Card, so I applied a month before departure. It is convenient as you could use it during your trip to Europe. I have also opened a virtual bank account on Wise, as it gives me a UK bank account number.

# Social Clubs & Networking Opportunities

You could join AMBS or the International Society WhatsApp group to get up to date information. They will also send you emails occasionally, showing you some upcoming events.

### Health & Safety

You could buy alcohol spray in convenience stores to clean your room. You should bring some medicine and testing kits with you.

# <u>Food</u>

As I am living in a catered hall, I ate breakfast and dinner with my friends in the dining room. Sometimes we may self-cook in the kitchen and buy ingredients from the stores nearby. You could enjoy Asia food in the China Town.

## **Transportation**

You should get a rail card if you want to travel around the UK, I usually use the app Trainline to buy train tickets. You could travel by bus or bicycle to school, it costs about 1-2GBP per ride.

## <u>Climate</u>

It is always raining in the UK, so make sure you get waterproof jackets and shoes.

## **Communication**

I used Vodaphone for the sim card and got 21GB per month. But I never reached the limit, I only used about 10GB per month.

#### Cautionary measures

Make sure you bring your belongings with you, my friend's laptop got stolen in our hall's common area. He reached the police and the university, but no one could really help.
