



# **General Study Abroad Information**

### Visa Procedures

As a mainland China passport holder, specific UK visa application was required, but the overall material and procedure is not complicated. You need to provide the offer from host university, bank statement for at least 6 months, and other required materials which can be easily found on UK immigration website. Once you receive offer, you can start making appointment online and the visa fee is around 700 HKD.

## **Orientation Activities**

Orientation date will change every year, so please read through the material and email carefully, and booked flight ticket arriving few days before. During the orientation, staff from host university will talk issues about everything you need to know living and studying London, so please feel free to ask for help if you have any questions.

# **International Services & Activities**

After the orientation, there will be an networking events for exchange students. Food and drinks will be served in the hall of the university. It is a great chance for you to know more friends and exchanging ideas for course selection and travel plans.

## Accommodations

Two types of accommodation are offered: share bathroom or not. The price for share is around 150 pounds a week (the Romano Court), while the other is more expensive. **I personally recommend the sharing one** if it is acceptable for you, not only because of the price, but also because the share one is very close to the Elizabeth line underground, which provide you a more convenient way of transporting than the Northern line, where the nonshare one located, yes, they are not in the same place.

### **Course Registration**

Course registration started shortly after you confirm the offer, and it lasts a long period after you go there for few weeks. During this period you can email the host university exchange team to help you choose or drop the course. As an exchange student, the procedure is easy and flexible, but the earlier you choose the course, the chance you get into it is bigger.

### **Teaching & Assessment Methods**

Overall, there is little pressure from learning aspect. Basically, every course is face-to-face now, but for the assessment, most of them can be completed online. Exchange student also can choose to take the alternative final exams, which will holder a month earlier than other students so that you can end the semester earlier and arrange your plan. The courses are given together with other local student and will have group projects.

# **Financing & Banking**

As a short term exchange student, it is totally fine to use your own visa

card without applying a local bank card. You can bring a small amount of cash with you, but most of the time you won't need it. The transporting and living cost is a little higher than Hong Kong, but many places can use student discount, so feel free to ask before you pay.

# Climate

The temperature in the UK for spring semester is around 10 degree Celsius for most of the time, but it can still drops to 0 degree in some case. Prepare warmer cloth than Hong Kong of course. Also, it is always raining and windy in the UK, **so I also recommend you bring water & wind proof clothes and shoes with you.** 

## Health & Safety

You can bring some common use medicine with you since it is very expensive and difficult to get to the hospital in the UK. You can also easily find Chinese medicine around Chinatown area, but it cost much than in Hong Kong.

Safety is also a big issue in London and you must learn how to protect yourself. You'd better not going out after 10 p.m. by yourself or walking to places like alley with few people. You must also take care of your phone and wallet every second walking on the street, since you might never know how the theft will take your property away. I have heard the story of so many friends or other people of how they are being stolen or robbed, so please be careful, especially in the downtown area. The truth is that countless stealing and robbing cases are happening in London every day and it is almost impossible for policemen to chase your things back, so you must build up the awareness of safety and protect your own property.

#### Food

London is an international city and you can find everything for eating in the city, and most of them do have a good flavor. Since the campus is very close to Chinatown, you can easily have a taste of hometown if you feel sick of other food. But the cost of eating outside is high, 30 pounds or more is the normal price for me to eat outside.

You can use the kitchen and refrigerator in the ensuite to prepare food by yourself, which is a much more economical way. There are a few restaurants in the campus and the price is fair, you can also try them before or after class.

## **Transportation**

The public transportation in the UK is very convenient, no matter by underground, train, bus, or airplane. As a student, you can apply student discount for most of the transportation, so please bring your student ID and visa with you to the underground station to buy an discounted Oyster Card and Railroad card. They are just like octopus card and you can top up money for travelling.

At first you might have some problems finding the correct entrance or platform, so feel free to ask staff in the station. Also it is very normal to have a delay or even close for the public transport, so please check more times on Google map and make sure the travel time for you.

#### Communication

Students and teachers in the campus are very friendly and willing to provide you help. People outside are also kind in most cases, but again, please be alert when you are outside, since thieves and scammers really like to target at Asian students.

You can buy SIM card in local market easily, like Tesco, Waitrose, Sainsbury, etc. I bought a Giffgaff SIM card after landing London, and the price is about 12 pounds a month for 20GB, which is quite enough for me.

### **Sports & Recreation Facilities**

School will provide gyms and other sports court for students. You can also choose to join a sport club in the school.

For bar or club outside, you will be required to show your ID before you go.
