
FEB 2023

# MAR 2023



# GENERAL STUDY ABROAD INFORMATION

#### VISA PROCEDURES

For the exchange in the Netherlands, you have to apply for a Dutch resident permit. The university will arrange their immigration coordinators to walk you through each step of applying for the permit. The university will gather the required documents and the €207 application fee for IND, and they will aid you in giving them all to the IND.

After your school has submitted your visa application, you need to apply on your own for the MVV, a 90-day visa that allows you to enter the Netherlands prior the distribution of the resident permit. You can apply earlier to ensure that you receive the MVV before your departure because the MVV appointments tend to be extremely busy in the late-December. The MVV takes 1-2 weeks to process.

Your residence permit can be obtained through the university once you have arrived in the Netherlands. Furthermore, you should schedule an appointment with the city hall to register as a citizen to obtain a BSN number for your bank account.

# <u>ACCOMMODATIONS</u>

The closest housing from the university is Professor Verbernelaan ("Verbs"), which is recommended by the school. There are approximately 170 exchange students that can reside in Verbs, which has two buildings for exchange students, hence there are few rooms available. There is enough privacy because the rooms are single rooms. The kitchen and bathrooms are shared. You can chat with other international students while you are dining in the kitchen.

In mid-November, applications for Verbs open. Because the website is not operating very smoothly and the availability will be running out very soon, you will need to set aside some time for the application.

#### ORIENTATION ACTIVITIES

TOP week is an orientation program put on by a Tilburg University student organization. It lasts for three days and is full of activities with parties, movie nights, and city tours. This is the best chance to make friends from other nations at this event. Throughout TOP week, the university also offers a variety of introductory talks and welcoming workshops.

# SOCIAL CLUBS & NETWORKING OPPORTUNITIES

For international students, there is a student organization called ESN that provides a variety of activities. Every Tuesday and Thursday night, there are parties that are open to ESN members. If you want to take part in their activities, you can pay to become a member. In addition, open parties are held to jointly celebrate Dutch holidays.

#### SPORTS & RECREATION FACILITIES

The university's sports center, which is right next to the Verbs, offers a gym, a sauna, and a variety of courses. You receive two free trial memberships. After then, only those who paid for a membership will be able to use it. The cost of the six-month membership is €107.95, while the monthly pass is €24.95.

# COURSE REGISTRATION

To allow the university to process and determine whether you are permitted to register for the courses, the proposed study plan should be submitted first. You can begin the process in late September and make changes up until the end of the exchange period. The only courses that can be registered for in OSIRIS are those that are approved for study in the study plan.

The Spring semester consists of two blocks. Block 3 begins on January 30, 2023, and depending on the school, course registration of Block 3 and Spring Semester begins on January 16, 2023. Block 4 begins in April, while registration for courses begins in late March.

# TEACHING & ASSESSMENT METHODS

Tilburg University's courses are composed of lectures, tutorials, and office hours. Some of the courses, particularly the language classes, had attendance requirements of at least 80%, while others had none at all.

The syllabus lists the elements that make up the course grade. To pass the course, you must get at least 55%.

# **COMMUNICATION**

The majority of the people in the Netherlands are able to understand and speak English, despite Dutch being the official language.

You will receive a sim card from the university in your orientation kits. Depending on your needs, you can activate and choose the data bundle plan.

# FINANCE & BANKING

When applying for a visa, you must transfer about €4,800 to the university. As soon as you arrive in the Netherlands and register for a BSN number, you have to apply for a Dutch bank. The two Dutch banks that most exchange students will use are ABN AMRO and Revolut.

# FOOD

Most exchange students cook in their dorms because eating out costs between €12 and €20 per meal. In the city, there are two supermarkets that are ubiquitous: Jumbo and Albert Heijn. There is also Asian market where you can purchase certain Asian ingredients.

#### TRANSPORTATION

In the city, biking is the most preferred mode of transportation. You can rent a bike from Unibike or Swapfiets, and if maintenance is needed, they will provide it. If you don't have a bike, your only option for getting to the city center is by bus.

The closest airport is Eindhoven Airport, and flights from here are probably operated by a low-cost airline. However, if you book the ticket that departs in the early morning, there might not be buses, which are the only option of transportation to get to the airport.

#### CLIMATE

Since there are only a few days that it snows in the Netherlands, I considered it a great blessing to have snow when I first arrive in Tilburg. However, the weather in the spring is unpredictable; it rained for an hour before turning sunny. The Netherlands became extremely hot starting in late May due to a heat wave. During the day, it is about 30°C, and at night, it is about 18°C. It is really hot because the rooms have no fans and air conditioners.

# HEALTH & SAFETY

Tilburg University has no medical center or clinic. If necessary, you have to buy medicine from the pharmacy. You can get further information and assistance when you need it from the Tilburg University Study Abroad & Exchange Team. In addition, it is a requirement of the Dutch law that we were covered by health insurance while we were there.

The Netherlands is one of the safest countries in the world. While residing in Tilburg and other Dutch cities, you are secure. But keep in mind to take good care of your bike because it has been reported that a few bikes are stolen each year.

#### CAUTIONARY MEASURES

Although you are permitted to use Air Pods or other Bluetooth devices while cycling, you should be aware while cycling. You cannot use the phone and ride the bike at the same time. When biking at night, remember to turn on your front and rear lights.
