2) SMU conducts an online session where they tell you about the information about the Visa Procedures. In general, students need to apply for an In-Principle Approval (IPA) letter from the Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA). On arrival, you would need to collect in person and SMU would also arrange this which made the process much more easier.

3) A passport copy and a copy of your own photo would be required during the IPA procedure.

4) The visa fees were about 90SGD.
