August

I embarked on my journey and arrived in Stockholm, Sweden in mid-August, marking my first time setting foot outside of Asia. Upon my arrival at the airport, I was fortunate to meet two schoolmates who were also hailing from Hong Kong. Like me, they were about to begin their exchange studies in business and management at Uppsala University. Settling in my student housing, I became acquainted with my neighbours who hailed from a plethora of different countries, which immediately enriched my cultural experience.

August

In the initial two weeks following my arrival, I took the opportunity to explore the city. I familiarized myself with the school's environment, enthusiastically participated in the welcoming activities organized by the student nations, and fulfilled my curiosity by visiting popular markets and the iconic IKEA store. I found that the cost of living was generally on par with Hong Kong, however, the restaurants leaned towards the pricier side. The food, vastly different from Asian cuisine, was a novel experience, and I embraced it wholeheartedly, sampling meatballs, burgers, salads, and pizza.

September

The semester began in earnest in September. Over the first two months, I would be immersing myself in the "Management and Control" course. The learning style in Sweden diverged significantly from what I was accustomed to in Hong Kong. Rather than traditional lectures, we were assigned numerous literature and research papers to read. We then had to synthesize our understanding of the theories into weekly group reports on specific topics. These reports were presented and discussed with other groups during class. While I initially found the style daunting, I committed to contributing my ideas and collaborating effectively with my groupmates. The process was thoroughly enjoyable and it fostered a close interaction with classmates hailing from diverse countries such as the U.S., France, and Ukraine. Keen to learn more about Scandinavian cultures, I embarked on a trip to Copenhagen, Denmark with the two Hong Kong friends I made recently.

October

Sweden's culinary offerings were truly amazing, but I must admit, I still longed for the familiarity of eastern foods. Consequently, I started buying more food ingredients from the markets, honing my cooking skills in the process. I even invited my neighbours to sample some Asian dishes that I prepared. After completion of the first course, we were given a two-week semester break, which I used to explore more destinations. My travels took me to London, U.K., where some experiences felt remarkably similar to Hong Kong. In late October, I ventured to the Baltic countries and experienced my first snowfall in Estonia.

November

The semester resumed, and the intensity ramped up with two new courses - "International Business Strategy" and "Business in Networks". As a Math and Econ student from HKUST, these business courses proved a bit challenging. We had to prepare lengthy presentations, followed by even longer Q&A sessions. Despite the demanding nature of these tasks, I put in my best efforts and found it to be an invaluable opportunity to build my confidence and enhance my public speaking skills.

December

A noteworthy incident occurred during the Christmas holiday when my Singaporean neighbour forgot his key card. Unlike the service efficiency we were accustomed to, the 24-hour hotline service was unresponsive during the holiday. As a temporary solution, I offered him a place to stay for the night in my room, and it was not until the following day that we were able to resolve the issue.
