Application Deadlines	For the spring semester (early January start): September 1 For the fall semester (late August start): April 1 Our deadlines are soft, which means that we will accept applications even after these deadlines. However, applications need to be received with enough time for internal processing (at least 9 weeks) and for the student to go through the visa application process in their home country.
TOEFL Requirements	Paper Based TOEFL (PBT) 550, with no sub-score below 52 Internet Based TOEFL (IBT) 79, with no sub-score below 17
Admission Requirements	 Academic Requirement: Students must be in good standing with their university, specific requirements and prerequisites may apply to certain courses or departments Proof of Financial Support (POF): In order to obtain a visa to study in the United States, students must provide documentation (student or parent bank account or other documentation) stating the student will have sufficient funds for each semester - see exact amounts below. Proof of financial support is very important for the processing of visas, and should be included with the initial application. Estimate POF for academic year 2016-2017 (subject to change): One semester undergraduate: Tuition: \$10,329.00 (waived for exchange students) Expenses: \$8,102.00 (room, board, health insurance, books, living etc.) Total POF: \$18,431.00 Academic Year undergraduate (two semesters): Tuition: \$20,658.00 (waived for exchange students) Expenses: \$16,204.00 (room, board, health ins, books, living etc.) Total POF: \$36,861.00 Letter of Interest: Please submit an essay (approximately 300 words) describing the following: Why you want to study abroad and why you are interested in the American Semester Program How studying abroad will help you meet your academic, professional and personal goals What personal strengths you have that support your acceptance into this program How you plan to apply your experience upon returning to your home institution
Estimated Costs	 Students coming to Michigan State University should refer to their exchange office for specific exchange agreement. In general, exchange students pay: Home institution tuition Room and Board, educational supplies, health insurance, fees & taxes (see estimated student budget chart below) Students should also budget for additional living and travel expenses

Accommodation and Meals	 Michigan State University is home to one of the largest residence hall systems in the United States. This means MSU has a largely residential campus. Living on campus with an American roommate is a great way to experience American culture and is an important part of every Spartan's college experience! To meet different financial needs and personal preferences of students, Michigan State University offers a variety of residence hall accommodations. All halls are co-educational. Men and women are housed in separate suites on separate floors or on the same floor and share dining, recreational, study and classrooms facilities. Application Requirements, Process, and Deadlines	 Apply to The American Semester Program in four easy steps: 1. Step One Make sure you meet admissions requirements 2. Step Two Check with your study-abroad office to confirm that you are eligible to transfer MSU credits to your degree. 3. Step Three Collect all the necessary paperwork needed prior to applying.
