Possibility to take course from other faculties?	Yes, if pre-requisites and space allow. Business exchange students must take at least 50% of their courses from the Faculty of Business Administration (e.g. 3 of 5)
Course Registration Process	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students submit a course selection form indicating their top 10 course choices. Course selection forms must be approved and signed by the student's home university. 2. The course selection forms are reviewed by the IPO in conjunction with an academic advisor to ensure students meet pre-requisite course requirements. 3. The IPO will then conduct registration on the students' behalf (in July for fall or November for winter), registering them in their top selected and approved courses. <p>Students will be contacted via email if alternative course selections need to be made.</p>
Housing	<p>On-Campus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <u>May be available</u> to students studying for the 4-month, fall semester. However, due to high demand, positions are not guaranteed. ▪ Students who are coming for the winter semester are able to apply for the waitlist. Health Insurance	All registered international students are automatically enrolled in Memorial University's foreign health insurance plan. Purchase of this insurance plan is mandatory and there is no option for exchange students to opt out of the plan (even if they have already purchased additional international health insurance coverage). The cost is approximately \$206.84/semester .

<p>Buddy Program/Orientation?</p>	<p>Yes. There is the MUN Mentors Program in which students from Memorial are paired with exchange students to help them get oriented in St. John's. There are also orientation activities organised during the first couple weeks of the semester to help the students get acquainted with the campus and St. John's. Additional activities are often organised for the exchange students throughout the semester.</p>	
<p>Can exchange students work on-campus?</p>	<p>There are on-campus jobs available to MUN's international students called ISWEP positions (International Student Work Experience Program) which are posted online during the first week of each semester. More information about the ISWEP program can be found on the MUN website: www.mun.ca/isa/employment/ISWEP.php.</p> <p>International students must have a valid study permit and Social Insurance Number (SIN) to be eligible for ISWEP positions. All students who are studying in Canada for more than 6 months are required to apply for a study permit. However, students who study at MUN for less than 6 months generally do not. Therefore, if students are interested in applying for a job on-campus, they will need to apply for a study permit (even if they are coming for less than 6 months).
