Health Insurance information

Effective April 30, 2012, students who are eligible for Canadian study permits (students studying in Canada for over 6 months) will be eligible for health insurance coverage through the Manitoba Health card. Students who are not eligible for a Canadian study permit must obtain international health and dental coverage from their home country or through a private insurance company upon their arrival. Health coverage is strongly recommended for all incoming exchange students, as uninsured medical treatment can be very costly.

Visa Information

Some students, depending on the length of study in Canada and their country of citizenship, will require a visa and study permit. Please contact your closest Canadian consulate for information about your specific visa requirements.

Effective March 15, 2016, all citizens from visa-exempt countries are required to have an Electronic Travel Authorization BEFORE arriving in Canada. Please visit <u>http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/eta.asp</u> for information. Applications can be made online through the link above.

Please <u>apply online as soon as possible</u>. You do not need to wait for your acceptance to the University of Manitoba to apply for a room. Space is limited and we encourage you to apply early for the best chance at getting a room.

	Off-campus housing Renting an apartment on your own can be a difficult option for exchange students, particularly if you plan to stay in Winnipeg for less than one year. Because standard rental practice requires you to sign a one-year lease when renting an apartment, when you leave prior to the expiration of your lease, you are still responsible for making monthly rental payments.

Course choices: Examinations	Exchange students can select any course that is offered during their exchange semester as long as the student meets prerequisite requirements and there is space available in the course. Some courses may require professor approval for enrolment. Students may take courses outside of the Asper School of Business, such as in Economics, Psychology or History, but approval is subject to these departments.
