<p>Mandatory Fees</p>	<p>All students, including exchange students are required to pay Organization Fees per the University of Manitoba mandate. These fees will be approximately \$115 per term and will vary based on the number of registered courses. <i>Fee deadlines are subject to change.</i></p> <p>Expected Fee Deadlines: October 3, 2018 (Fall Term) February 5, 2019 (Winter/Spring Term)</p> <p>Fees must be paid by the deadline or late fees will be incurred. Health Insurance information

Effective April 30, 2012, students who are eligible for Canadian study permits (students studying in Canada for over 6 months) will be eligible for health insurance coverage through the Manitoba Health card. Students who are not eligible for a Canadian study permit must obtain international health and dental coverage from their home country or through a private insurance company upon their arrival. Health coverage is strongly recommended for all incoming exchange students, as uninsured medical treatment can be very costly.

Visa Information

Some students, depending on the length of study in Canada and their country of citizenship, will require a visa and study permit. Please contact your closest Canadian consulate for information about your specific visa requirements.

Effective March 15, 2016, all citizens from visa-exempt countries are required to have an Electronic Travel Authorization BEFORE arriving in Canada. Please visit <http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/eta.asp> for information. Applications can be made online through the link above.

Off-campus housing

Renting an apartment on your own can be a difficult option for exchange students, particularly if you plan to stay in Winnipeg for less than one year. Because standard rental practice requires you to sign a one-year lease when renting an apartment, when you leave prior to the expiration of your lease, you are still responsible for making monthly rental payments.

Learning Expectations	
Language of instruction	English
Class format	Lectures, class analysis/presentations, papers & projects, 39 contact hours for each 3 credit hour course
Class participation	Class participation is required for most classes
Course grading	Letter graded (A+-F), with a D being a marginal pass
Class size	Normally 40-60 students
Course load:	3-4 courses per term are suggested. Students may take 5, but this is considered a heavy course load, especially for students whose first language is not English.
Course choices:	Exchange students can select any course that is offered during their exchange semester as long as the student meets prerequisite requirements and there is space available in the course. Some courses may require professor approval for enrolment. Students may take courses outside of the Asper School of Business, such as in Economics, Psychology or History, but approval is subject to these departments. Examinations	Format of exams vary. Final exams are written in the last 2 weeks of the school. Students must stay in Winnipeg until they complete all exam requirements. Requests of early leave of exams are not permitted.
