Students may take courses in other University of Minnesota departments on a space-available basis with instructor approval.

The Economics Department is not housed in the Carlson School of Management. Exchange students are able to request space in no more than 2 ECON courses per semester, and there is no guarantee that there will be space available.

### **Course Selection**

Course offerings are found on the One Stop website under "Class Search": onestop.umn.edu

- Minimum course load = 12 UMN credits
- Maximum course load = 20 UMN credits
- 3000, 4000 and 5000 level courses are undergraduate courses at the University of Minnesota and are available to bachelor's and master's exchange students.
- 6000 level (and above) courses are graduate courses at the University of Minnesota and are available to master's exchange students only.

The official registration session is held during the Welcome Program, one week prior to the start of class. Students will be asked to complete a course preference form in advance, and should have alternate options in case a course they select is full. Some courses are not available to exchange students. # Estimated Expenses

The exchange program covers the cost of tuition and most fees. Students are responsible for any additional costs. On average, students should budget approximately **\$9,029** for the semester:

## Arrival

Most students fly into the Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport (MSP). Travel from the airport to campus is easy by taxi, shuttle or light rail train, and full details are provided on the website. Students from the buddy program are sometimes available to pick students up at the airport, though this service is not guaranteed.

### Welcome Program

The Welcome Program is a week-long series of events to help exchange students learn about the city, the University of Minnesota, and the Carlson School of Management. Attendance is mandatory for all exchange students. The program is held the week prior to the start of classes.
