Each student is sent the course registration materials once registration information is available. Each student is required to complete his/her course selections by a deadline designated by Washington University. Course selections will be processed and each student will be notified if his/her request can be accommodated. Each student will have the opportunity to update his/her schedule once s/he arrives on campus.

Students typically check in about five days before classes begin in order to complete the University's orientation program.

<i>Visa Requirements</i>	The document I-20 (for prospective F-1s) or DS-2019 (for prospective J-1s) serves as proof that you have been admitted to an academic program at Washington University. The issuance of the I-20 or DS-2019 by itself does not guarantee that you will be granted an F-1 or J-1 entry visa (if you are now outside the U.S.) or that you have acquired F-1 or J-1 status.	
<i>Campus Facilities</i>	The business school is located in Simon Hall on the Danforth campus of Washington University in St. Louis.	

	Students also have access to multiple libraries, a student union, and residential halls, in addition to Arts and Sciences buildings.
<i>Distance from city / airport</i>	Lambert-St. Louis International Airport is about twelve miles from campus. Downtown St. Louis is about 7 miles from campus. Washington University is located on a metrolink subway line and you can get to the airport and downtown via metrolink.
